DOG Vaccinations – what you should know.

Rabies vaccinations are required by law and is normally given every 3 years by a veterinarian. **However,** The American Veterinary Hospital Association questions whether annual vaccinations should be given to an older dog due to a deadly anemia associated with annual vaccinations. Look at: www.hemopet.org. Search for AAHA Vaccination Guidelines. (The anemia is not associated with rabies vaccinations.)

ALSO, google "New Vaccination Protocol by Jean Dobbs" The article says, in brief, "Dogs immune systems mature fully at 6 months. If a modified live virus vaccine is given after 6 months of age, it produces immunity, which is good for the life of the pet (i.e.: canine distemper, parvo, etc.). If another MLV vaccine is given a year later, the antibodies from the first vaccine neutralize the antigens of the second vaccine and there is little or no effect. The titer is not "boosted". Not only are annual boosters for parvo and distemper unnecessary, they subject the pet to potential risks of allergic reactions and immune-mediated hemolytic anemia. There is no scientific documentation to back up label claims for annual administration of MLV vaccines." **ASK YOUR VET.**
